# **Staff Benefits Survey Results**

#### **Beneficial benefits!**

Thank you to those staff (68 employees) who took the time to feedback on our staff benefits, we were pleased to find that 74% of you thought that our benefits package was better or much better than those of other employers. The survey focused on the benefits that came lower down in the list of appreciation in this year's staff survey, we know you like the well-being £60 per term!

#### In summary:

- The Friday lunch is very much appreciated and thought of as an opportunity for staff to socialise with colleagues.
- The childcare and cycle schemes are not widely in use.


- In general, RPG sessions are welcomed but the current format should be changed to make them more useful.
- Very few respondents have accessed the employee assistance programme either online or by telephone (13%). Those who have used it didn't necessarily feel the service has met their needs.
- In terms of what type of benefits the respondents are interested in; 81% long term financial planning (e.g. pension contributions, life assurance), 71% healthcare (medical insurance, access to counselling) and 65% healthy lifestyle (such as fruit, gym classes).
